



**Stanislaus Collaborative - FDM Data Report**  
**Data as of November 28<sup>th</sup> 2016**  
**Ignacio A. Navarro Ph.D.<sup>1</sup>**

During the March 2012- July 1<sup>st</sup> 2016 period the Stanislaus Collaborative completed 6,329 assessments with 4,351 families using the FDM<sup>2</sup>. This report presents the data collected in the FDM on these Families by fiscal year. Table one below details the number of assessments (visits) families had in the 11-12/16-17 period. As the table shows, out of the 4,351 families that received services in the Stanislaus Collaborative, 1,667 had a first assessment during fiscal year 12-13; and out of those, 482 received a second assessment, 137 received a third assessment, 37 received a fourth assessment, and 35 received 5 or more assessments.

Figure 1: Percent of families at stable or self sufficient level on first assessment by indicator

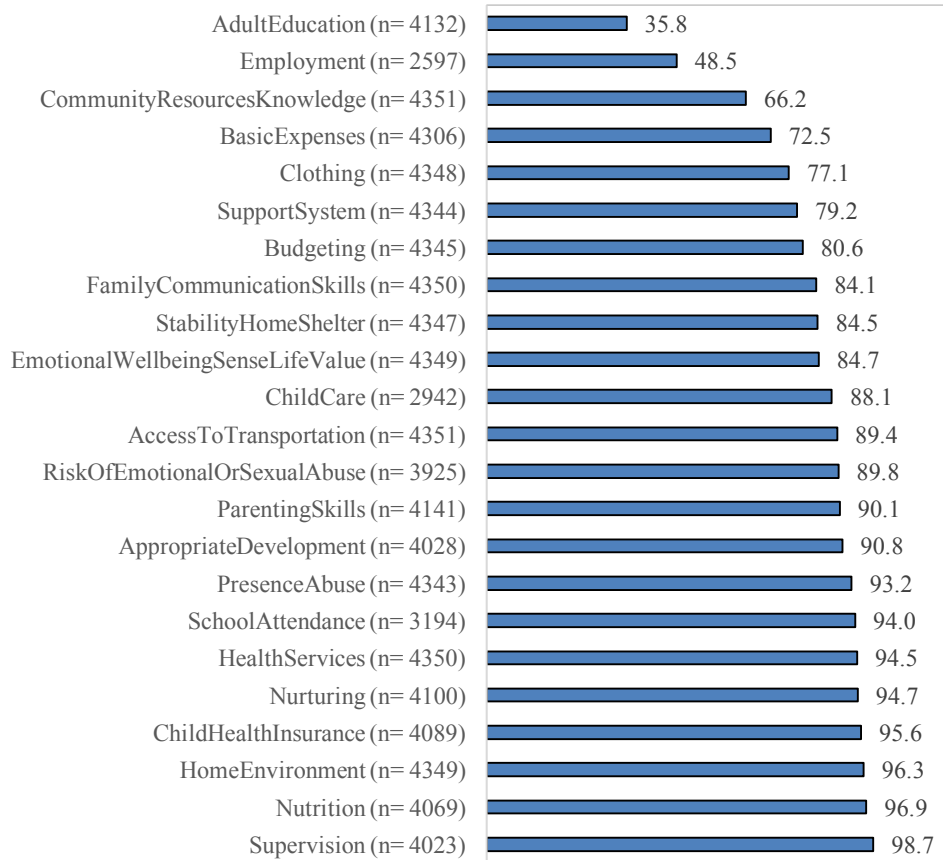


Figure 2: Percent of Families at "Stable" or "Self Sufficient" level on first and second Assessment (for families with 2+ assessments)
