In a parenting series at Stanton FRC, put on in conjunction with the Raise Foundation, parents were asked "what it means to them to love their children.

To some parents, it meant working as much as they could in order to be able to provide material things their children may need or want. To other parents, it meant telling them "I love you" at bedtime and giving them a kiss.

However, to children, even if they don't realize it, Love means Time.

It is not enough to provide material things, and it is not enough to give them words. You really love your children when you also give them 'Quality Time'. This is what Alejandro, a Latino dad attending the series realized. He shared with the rest of the class that he was not spending enough quality time with his children because of his work schedule. His 3 year old daughter often asked him to go...to the park, but he refused because he was tired or he had to go to work. Previously he didn't realize how important it [was] to spend quality time with his little girl.

As a result of attending the Parenting series he made a commitment to himself and his children to make time in his busy schedule to be dedicated to them."
