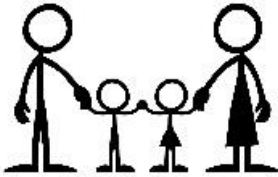
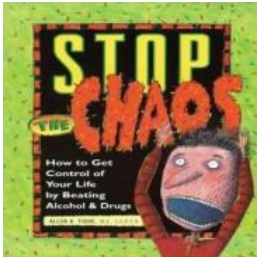


Family and Community Resource Center of Weed

Through the Family and Community Resource Center of Weed (FCRCW) we provide an array of services that are recognized throughout the Family Resource Center Network. With parenting and First 5 programs being a major funding source we provide many educational programs, play-groups and family events that promote healthy living with proper nutrition, literacy and nurturing parenting styles. We provide parenting education programs, the Nurturing Parenting series, Relapse Prevention classes, Anger Management classes and one time educational workshops which the topics that are designed to meet the communities needs and wants. We have three family advocates who work directly with families and individuals on empowering them to achieve their identified goals, application assistance and peer support while recording their progress in the Family Development Matrix. We also participate in the CAPIT program that works directly with Child Protective Service as a home visit program in hopes to engage the families into the FCRCW where they then become connected to the community and more closely with the FCRCW programs.

As another funding source through Mental Health Services Act we provide Prevention and Early Intervention activities. We are providing case management for families and are also facilitating a drug and alcohol class for teenagers, Stop the Chaos, where mandated teens are referred from Juvenile Probation and the High School. We are also very active with creating a new local Drug Free Communities Coalition in collaboration with the Weed High School, the community and the Committed Athlete program. We will be planning alternative activities for the youth in our community along with designing a social media campaign to promoting teens to live a healthy life style with out drugs and alcohol.
